# the City of Winter Springs **COMMISSION REPORT**

During the month of October 2012, the following Ordinances, Resolutions, Contracts and Agreements were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

## **Ordinances:**

**Ordinance 2012-15** – Updated Chapter 6, Buildings and Building Regulations, of the Code of Ordinances.

## **Resolutions:**

**Resolution 2012-40** – Approved certain revisions to the Community Development Block Grant Cooperation Agreement and maintains the City’s participation in the Urban Counties Program.

## **Contracts/Agreements:**

- The City Commission accepted the 2013 Florida Department of Law Enforcement - Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant.
- The City Commission approved a Neighborhood Street Sign and Light Improvement Agreement with Mattamy Partnership of Jacksonville for the Jesup’s Landing Subdivision.
- The City Commission entered into a contract agreement with Central Florida Environmental Corporation for construction of the Central Winds Park Drainage Improvements.

- The City Commission authorized the City to enter into a contract agreement with The Middlesex Corporation for Asphalt Resurfacing of Various City Streets.

# LANDSCAPING TIPS

## Pruning Trees



Now that cooler weather has arrived, perhaps you are taking to the yard to catch up on some lawn maintenance projects. The fall and winter months are a great time to prune your trees. Below are some helpful suggestions on the proper way to prune a tree to promote strong structure and health.

Pruning your trees when they are small is an excellent way to promote strong branch structure and better enable the trees to withstand strong winds. A good rule of thumb is not to remove branches that are 1/3 the diameter of the branch or trunk they are attached to. Removing branches that are almost the same size as the branch or trunk they are attached to significantly decreases the chances that the wound will heal. An unhealed pruning wound is an entry point for fungi, insects and bacteria that can cause decay in the tree. Coatings or treatments designed for covering pruning wounds have not been proven to be effective and have sometimes been found to cause more harm than good and therefore, are generally not recommended.

Use a sharp pruning saw for branches over 1" in diameter. A pair of loppers can be used for removing smaller branches. Executing a clean, proper pruning cut is very important. The diagrams below show how to remove a limb properly. The undercut shown in the graphic below will prevent the bark from peeling or ripping when the limb is removed. Leaving the branch collar is the most important step. The branch collar is the swollen area at the base of the branch and is important because it is the portion of the tree that forms the callus over the pruning wound. Without a callus, the tree is susceptible to decay.

When removing branches, it is best to remove the branch all the way back to the branch collar at the main trunk or to a lateral branch (shown below). Do not cut the branch at any random point, leaving a stub. The overall goal is to establish a tree with a single dominant trunk where the branches are less than half the size of the main trunk. You can accomplish this by removing and/or shortening competing branches.

If you plan to prune your trees yourself, rather than hiring a tree company, be sure that you can reach the upper portion of the canopy and that you are not just trimming branches you can reach from the ground. In order to remove all dead wood, properly balance the tree, and make proper pruning cuts to improve tree structure, you will need to be able to reach the entire canopy of the tree. ## TIP OF THE MONTH

This holiday season, don't let the spirit of giving lull you into giving burglars, muggers, and pickpockets a better chance to do their dirty work. Crooks love the holidays as much as everyone else, but chiefly because it's an opportune time for crime.



Homes jam-packed with glittering gifts; stores, malls and downtown streets teeming with unsuspecting shoppers; people rushing around, stressed out and careless, looking for last minute gifts, trying to get everything done. It's enough to make a crook giddy with holiday joy. Here are some tips on how to celebrate safely this holiday season:

### If You're Traveling

- Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask a neighbor to watch your home and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Don't forget to have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.

### If You're Out For The Evening

- Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone's home.
- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes.
- Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

### If You're Shopping

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you.
- Park in a well-lighted space, and be sure to lock the car, close the windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash: pay with a check or credit card where ever possible.
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Don't overburden yourself with packages. Be careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket.
- Shopping with kids? Teach them to go to a store clerk or security if you get separated.

## ON-STREET PARKING PROHIBITION TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED

- Any street with a roadway width of less than 22-feet of parkable street width (includes gutter or Miami curb)
- Paved streets with no curb or gutter, except as determined on a case-by-case basis


