# the City of Winter Springs **COMMISSION REPORT**

During the month of September 2012, the following Ordinances, Resolutions, Contracts and Agreements were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

## **Ordinances:**

**Ordinance 2012-11** – Effectively dissolved the Beautification of Winter Springs Advisory Board and delegated those responsibilities to various other City Boards and Committees, City Staff, and other parties deemed appropriate by the City Manager.

**Ordinance 2012-12** – Amended Section 5-8 of the City Code to require that the City Arborist make a recommendation to the City Commission regarding the historic tree process.

## **Resolutions:**

**Resolution 2012-31** – Established the Final Operating Millage Rate of 2.4300 mills and the Final Voted Debt Service Millage Rate at 0.1100 Mills for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 for the City of Winter Springs.

**Resolution 2012-32** – Established the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013.

## **Contracts and Agreements:**

- The City Commission approve the replat of Jesup's Landing.
- The City Commission approved an agreement with Dora Landscaping Company for landscape maintenance services.

- The City Commission approved an agreement with Annan Landscaping Company for landscape maintenance services.
- The City Commission approved an agreement with Severn Trent Environmental Services for meter-reading services.
- The City Commission approved a contract renewal with Clarke Aquatic Services, Inc., for aquatic weed control and maintenance services.

## **Of Special Interest:**

- The City Commission appointed Mr. Rick Lecky to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee.
- The Mayor and City Commission heard a presentation from Mr. Cory Skeates, Executive Director, Oviedo-Winter Springs Regional Chamber of Commerce on the services and the events with which the Chamber is affiliated.
- The City Commission approved the display of the phrase, "In God We Trust," in the Commission Chambers behind the dais and incorporation of the phrase into the official City Seal.



## **CITY COMMISSION MEETINGS - HOLIDAY SCHEDULE**

In consideration of the upcoming holidays, the City Commission meeting schedule has been modified as follows:

**November 2012** - the City Commission will hold a Special Meeting on Monday, November 19th, 2012, which will begin promptly after the Inauguration Ceremony which begins at 4:30 p.m. There will be no other commission meetings in November.

**December 2012** - the City Commission will hold one Regular Meeting on Monday, December 10th, 2012, beginning at 5:15 p.m. The second Regular Meeting in December, which normally would be held on December 24th, will not be held.





# LANDSCAPING TIPS

## Time Change=\$\$ Savings

Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 4th. When turning your clocks back one hour, do not forget to adjust the clock on your irrigation timer. More importantly, do not forget to adjust your watering days from two days per week to one day per week. Standard Time incorporates late fall and winter; a time when grass and landscape plants are dormant. The plants are not growing as they do during the spring and summer, and therefore require less water. Adjusting your irrigation to account for seasonal change and your lawn's water requirements is a great way to conserve water and save money.

If you are unsure how to adjust your irrigation timer or would like to ensure you are applying the correct amount of water to sustain your lawn through the winter, please contact the City to schedule a free irrigation audit. We will help you adjust your timer and can measure the amount of water your irrigation system is applying to ensure your lawn is receiving enough water to keep it healthy during the winter. Daylight saving time begins the second Sunday in March and ends the first Sunday in November.  
Watering restrictions apply to all potable, well, and surface water sources.  
Reclaimed water may be used two days per week year round.

All of the City's Boards and Committees are appointed by the Mayor and City Commission.





# TIP OF THE MONTH

The Winter Springs Police Department would like your help by following these tips to aid in reducing auto burglaries. Remember that the best prevention against thefts from vehicles is to always lock your vehicle and not leave valuables visible. Let's work together to get the thieves out of Winter Springs. Don't be a victim, be safe. If you do see suspicious activity it is important to report it immediately to the Winter Springs Police Department by calling 911. If possible get a good description of the person(s), his/her clothing, color and make of vehicle and direction of travel. It is not always possible to get a complete vehicle license number. Even a partial license number is helpful. If you are not sure where you are, look for a land-mark or a street address on a building.

## MORE ON VEHICLE SAFETY

Law enforcement agencies throughout Seminole County today announced the launch of an intensive education and awareness campaign designed to prevent local motorists from becoming victims of vehicle burglary. Beginning today through the end of the year, local law enforcement agencies will conduct a series of coordinated safety checks, leaving assessment cards and courtesy notices on thousands of vehicles in typical burglary hotspot areas across the County. The notices are designed to encourage drivers to lock their cars and avoid leaving valuables on display. The campaign is expected to reach more than 10,000 motorists.

Crime statistics show 1,402 vehicle burglaries were committed in Seminole County during the first nine months of this year, a 3 percent increase over the same time last year. Vehicle burglaries are crimes of opportunity and take only seconds. Thieves enter through unlocked doors or open windows and often smash out windows to grab items left on seats. Thieves who steal credit cards, debit cards or checks typically try to make a transaction right away, and will likely make multiple transactions until funds are blocked. Other items stolen such as phones, laptops, GPS devices, and electronics, are kept for personal use, pawned, or resold to others.

Over the next 10 weeks, Seminole County law enforcement agencies will conduct safety checks of vehicles parked at locations such as gyms, schools/day cares, parks, and shopping centers. The total number of cards distributed, and the percent of vehicles that are "low risk" vs. "high risk" targets, will be continually updated at [www.seminolesheriff.org/VehicleSafety](http://www.seminolesheriff.org/VehicleSafety). Vehicles that are "high risk" are those unlocked, have a window open, have valuables in plain view, or have keys left in the vehicle.

The campaign is timed to coordinate with the holiday season and is in addition to a variety of investigative and enforcement efforts also underway. The initiative is a joint crime prevention effort between the Seminole County Sheriff's Office and the Altamonte Springs, Casselberry, Lake Mary, Longwood, Oviedo, Sanford, Winter Springs, and University of Central Florida police departments.

# LEADERSHIP SEMINOLE



In September, the current class of Leadership Seminole chose The Grove Academy as their year-long service project, coining the massive renovation "Operation Groverhaul." The 53-member class will refurbish the aging bathroom facilities, provide cozier shared living spaces, update the workout facility, spruce up the dining room, and provide additional recreational opportunities for teens recovering at The Grove. They will also give the gift of time to the adolescents living at The Grove through career workshops and social activities.



The Grove Academy, located in Winter Springs, was built in 1981 and exists as a safe place for adolescents to recover from serious alcohol and drug abuse disorders. Teens arrive at The Grove with the hope of healing from addiction, along with other trauma they have endured during their young life. Approximately 40% of the teens living at The Grove are in the foster care system. Another 30% are involved in the criminal justice system. A majority of the youth are from families without access to health insurance, and pay as little as \$2 per day to receive treatment. Providing young people with superior care using limited resources is a daily struggle at The Academy. Despite this struggle, The Grove was named the most effective organization in the Central Region for Children's Substance Abuse Treatment by the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) Substance Abuse and Mental Health Program in February of 2012.



## HAYES ROAD PLAZA PROJECT

Hayes Road Plaza is a commercial project, under construction on 1.99 acres at the southwest corner of the intersection of Hayes Road and SR 434. Hayes Road Plaza consists of 17,128 square feet and is a single-story shopping center that will include a 24-hour convenience store (7-11) without gas pumps, as well as spaces for restaurants and other retail uses. The property will include cross access driveways with properties to the west to enable vehicular traffic to access not only this facility but other businesses to the west without the necessity of using SR 434 to go between properties. Site work for the Hayes Road Plaza started on September 21, 2012 and includes clearing, grubbing, demolition, earthwork, installation of underground utilities, stormwater system, paving, concrete work, and preparation of the building pad.

## City of Winter Springs Road Construction Project Update October 2012

### **Project: Asphalt Resurfacing of Various City Streets**

**Status:** The following streets are scheduled to be milled and resurfaced starting in November 2012:

- o Camphorwood Street
- o Bitterwood Street (including Banyan Ct)
- o Birch Terrace
- o North Alderwood from Edgemon to Moss (including Bayberry Court and Cortez Court)
- o Chokecherry Drive - North of Winter Springs Boulevard
- o Shepard Road Repair (200 LF near Lisa Loop)
- o Twelve Oaks Drive
- o S Edgemon Avenue from Murphy to Bahama
- o Canadice Lane
- o Ironwood Court
- o Dog Park Road - Trail to Dog Park Entrance



The milling and resurfacing contract was awarded to The Middlesex Corporation and all streets are scheduled to be completed by January 2012.

City Staff will provide paving notices to residents in the immediate vicinity of the resurfacing work approximately one week before work begins. No roads will be closed and residents will have access to and from their driveways at all times.

### **Project: Shepard Road Streetscape**

**Description:** Streetscape improvements on Shepard Road from US 17/92 east to Wildwood Drive. Work includes asphalt milling and resurfacing, adding a landscaped median, curb and gutter, sidewalks, a stormwater management system, and landscape, irrigation, and hardscape improvements.

**Funding Source:** U.S. 17-92 Community Redevelopment Agency

**Status:** Construction completed in September 2012

### **Project: Michael Blake Boulevard**

**Description:** New two-lane City collector road in the Winter Springs Town Center from S.R. 434 north to Tuskawilla Road

**Funding Source:** One-Cent Sales Tax

**Status:** The segment from the Cross Seminole Trail north to Tuskawilla Road has been completed as part of the Winter Springs Village residential development. The segment from S.R. 434 north to the Cross Seminole Trail is a City project. Construction is scheduled to be complete by November 1, 2012.
