the City of Winter Springs **COMMISSION REPORT**



During the month of April 2012, the following Ordinances, Resolutions, Contracts and Agreements were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

Ordinances:

Ordinance 2012-05 – a Public Hearing for the Second Reading amending the Comprehensive Plan related to both the Town Center and GreeneWay Interchange District (GID) along with associated amendments to Policy 1.1.1: Land Use Categories. This Ordinance was then submitted to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity as required by Florida Statute 163.3184(3) Expedited State Review Amendment Process.

Resolutions:

Resolution 2012-14 – To accept the proposal by BB&T Bank to purchase the City's, Limited General Obligation Refunding Note, Series 2012 to refund the City's outstanding Limited General Obligation Bonds, Series 2002, not to exceed \$2,800,000; and authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to execute all necessary documents to complete a loan agreement with BB&T. (This re-negotiating of our Bond saved our citizens hundreds of thousands of dollars).

Resolution 2012-13 – Recognizing the retirement of Mr. Bill Nelson, Utility Department for his sixteen (16) years of service and contributions to the City.

Contracts and Agreements:

- An agreement with Creative Pyrotechnics was approved for a fireworks display on July 4, 2012.

- A Conditional Use was re-approved for Hayes Road Plaza, located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Hayes Road and SR 434 to allow a 24-hour convenience store without gas pumps in the C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial) Zoning District.
- An Aesthetic Review was re-approved for Hayes Road Plaza, located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Hayes Road and SR 434.
- A Public Hearing for the approval of an Aesthetic Review for the clubhouse of Winter Springs Village, located on Fanning Drive in Phase 1 of Winter Springs Village.

Of Special Interest:

- The City Commission received information from the Community Development Department related to the nominations of the re-write of the Adopted Town Center District Code for several State and National Awards.
- The Finance and Administrative Services Department informed the City Commission of extended business hours for Winter Springs' Utility customers.
- The City Commission validated the 2011-2012 Solid Waste Survey Results for Waste Pro for the period of March 1, 2011 – February 28, 2012 which showed a 97.1 customer satisfaction rate.
- A brief preliminary Budget overview from staff on the Fiscal Year 2013 Budget was provided to the Mayor and City Commission.
- The Mayor and City Commission received a presentation from the "Pathways to Home" organization which explained that more than 2,000 children in Seminole County are homeless, and that their program involves trying to find homes for families in need. LANDSCAPING TIPS

Determining Irrigation Run Times

How long should you run your irrigation system in order to apply enough water to keep your grass healthy? Zone run times vary widely depending on how the irrigation system is designed.

As a rule of thumb, stationary spray heads typically require less run time than rotor heads. Rotors move and therefore require more time to apply the same amount of water to a given area. Rather than basing your run time on accepted averages, such as 30 minutes for spray heads and 45 minutes for rotors, it is more efficient to measure the amount of water applied by each zone and then adjust your run times based on these measurements.

A “catch can test” can be performed as part of the City’s free irrigation audit service. Graduated cylinders are placed throughout the zone and the irrigation is ran overnight as normal. The following morning the cans are measured to determine the amount of water applied. It is recommended that you apply $\frac{3}{4}$ ” of water each time you run your irrigation system. Once the application rate has been measured, you can then adjust your irrigation run times to apply an average of $\frac{3}{4}$ ” of water. You can conduct a similar catch can test using empty tuna cans and a ruler. - Planning And Zoning Board/Local Planning Agency
- Tusawilla Lighting And Beautification District Advisory Committee (Meets Quarterly)





The Civic Center is located at 400 North Edgemon Ave. and is accessible to both State Road 434 as well as State Road 419.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS UPDATE

The following is a list of active development projects in the City of Winter Springs:



The Greens at Tusawilla – On April 18, 2012, a grand opening ceremony was held at The Greens at Tusawilla, a 60-unit townhome development located on the south side of Winter Springs Boulevard, east of the Tusawilla Country Club. In 2008, the project was originally approved for the construction of 60 condominium units. Infrastructure for the development consisting of streets, stormwater retention areas, and water and sewer lines were constructed following the original approval in 2008; however, the condominium buildings were never constructed. The new developer is constructing 60 townhome units in a Mediterranean architectural style utilizing the infrastructure that was constructed in 2008 in order to complete the development.

Town Center District Code re-write – On March 12, 2012, the City of Winter Springs City Commission unanimously adopted the re-write of the Town Center District Code. The revised Code represents the collective enthusiasm of neighborhood and local business stakeholders for creating a vibrant place where many people desire to live, work, and play. The code re-write was completed in-house by the Winter Springs Community Development Department. By preparing the re-write in house, an estimated cost savings of \$75,000 was passed along to the City's taxpayers. Following a workshop in August 2011, the City Commission unanimously directed City staff to re-write the Town Center District Code utilizing the concept of the "transect", which categorizes settlement patterns into zones ranging from a very rural character to a very urban character. The revised Town Center Code shows specific areas broken down into transects based on existing development or anticipated development trends. They are: T1 (Natural Zone), T3 (Suburban Zone), T4 (General Urban Zone), T5 (Urban Center Zone), and C/P (Civic/Public). To view a copy of the Code, [Click Here](#).

Jesup's Landing – Recently, site construction began on Jesup's Landing, a 171 unit townhome community located on the south side of Orange Avenue, behind Winter Springs High School in the Winter Springs Town Center. The property is the site of a townhome development that was approved in 2005 for 185 units. In 2007, the builder, Levitt & Sons declared bankruptcy and the property went into foreclosure. In 2011, the property was purchased by the new builder, Mattamy Homes. The proposed townhomes are all three story units, with a split level entrance between the first and second floor. The first floor is proposed to function as a daylight basement consisting primarily of a garage and room noted as a home office. The second and third floors contain the majority of the living area. One side of each unit is proposed with a two story balcony that will be accessible internally from each of the three floors of the units. In addition to these balconies, second floor balconies and stoops are proposed on the front of the buildings. Architectural elements including hardy-plank siding, stucco, columns, railings and a gabled roof are utilized in the design of the townhome buildings. In keeping with the design requirements of the Town Center, the units are accessed via alleyways with the garages provided in the rear. An Aesthetic Review of the proposed architectural elevations must be approved by the City Commission prior to construction of the townhome units.

Michael Blake Boulevard – On February 6, 2012, construction began on the completion of Michael Blake Boulevard. Once complete, Michael Blake Boulevard will connect the northern portions of



Tuskawilla Road with State Road 434. A signalized intersection will be provided at the intersection of State Road 434 and Michael Blake Boulevard. Construction of Michael Blake Boulevard will allow improved emergency access to area properties, allow an alternate route to State Road 434 when Tuskawilla Road is closed for special events, and enhance the economic development of the Town Center east of Tuskawilla Road. Michael Blake Boulevard is a key component of the City's Town Center Master Transportation Plan. Construction is scheduled to be completed in late July 2012.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS UPDATE Cont.



Moss Park Apartments – Recently, construction began on an 84-unit apartment complex located on a 9.1 acre site at the southeast corner of the intersection of North Moss Road and Rhoden Lane behind Bank of America. In addition, on May 29, 2012 the City Commission will consider approval of a Conditional Use on the adjacent commercial parcel adjacent to State Road 434 that would potentially contain a mixed use building with 15 residential units and 6,000 square feet of commercial uses.

Family Dollar – Recently, construction began on an 8,000 square foot Family Dollar store located on the north side of State Road 434, between Fairfax Avenue and Devon Avenue. During the review process, Family Dollar worked with city staff to provide upgraded architectural elements such as a water-table, faux windows with awnings on the portions of the building fronting Devon Avenue and Fairfax Avenue to help break up large expanses of brick walls and a slight “pop-out” of the front façade of the building at the entry doors to allow architectural variation to add to the quality of the building. The contractor estimates construction on the store will be completed in approximately 80-days. It is anticipated the store will be open for business soon after the completion of construction.

GrandeVille at Town Center – On May 29, 2012, the City Commission will consider approval of a Conceptual Plan for GrandeVille at Town Center, a 244 unit, 4-story apartment complex located adjacent to City Hall at the northwest corner of the intersection of Doran Drive and State Road 434. The building is designed as a “Texas Donut”, which means the apartment units will be constructed around the parking garage and amenities. The applicant is proposing amenities such as a tot lot, a swimming pool, a putting green, grills, cabanas, a fitness center, and community room. As part of the “Texas Donut” design concept, these amenities will be constructed in the courtyard of the building, with the apartment units being constructed around the perimeter of the amenity area. In addition, pedestrian access points leading to the interior of the building will be provided along the State Road 434 and Doran Drive frontages. The conceptual plan proposes construction of the building up to the edge of State Road 434 and Doran Drive. A 4-story building constructed to the edge of State Road 434 will help to further create the urban sense of place that has begun to materialize along State Road 434 with the completion of previously approved projects such as Jesup’s Reserve. This will help further turn this portion of State Road 434 into the urban boulevard that was envisioned in the Town Center master plan. The proposed project represents completion of a major portion of the Town Center core.

Viera, Parcel 14B – On May 14, 2012, the City Commission approved a Conceptual Plan and Aesthetic Review for the Viera Parcel 14B single-family development. The project consists of 36 single-family homes on 8.7 acres of property located on Dovera Drive, north of Red Bug Lake Road, within the Oviedo Marketplace Planned Unit Development. The project offers a mix of single-story and two-story homes. In addition, the builder, KB Home, is offering a ‘built to order’ floor plan that features various upgrades and options that provide homeowners with power to personalize their new home. Buyers will have the ability to select appliances, cabinets, countertops, lighting, flooring, and more in order to create a home that is truly tailored to their liking.

Hayes Road Plaza – On April 23, 2012, the City Commission re-approved a Conditional Use and Aesthetic Review for Hayes Road Plaza, a 17,000 square foot commercial shopping center. The property is located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Hayes Road and SR 434. The purpose of the Conditional Use approval is to allow a 24-hour convenience store without gas pumps in the C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial) zoning district. The Conditional Use was originally approved by the City Commission on January 26, 2009, and expired on January 26, 2011. Since the approval expired, the property owner was required to obtain re-approval for the convenience store use on the property. The owner held a pre-construction meeting with the City on May 21, 2012. Construction is anticipated to begin soon and is expected to last between six to eight months.
