the City of Winter Springs **COMMISSION REPORT**



During the month of August 2013, the following Ordinances, Resolutions, Contracts and Agreements were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

Ordinances:

Ordinance 2013-08 - Made text amendments to the Permitted Use and Conditional Use sections of the C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial), C-2 (General Commercial), and CC (Commerce Center) Zoning Districts, and strikes the phrase “start-up” from Section 20-345, “In General” of the CC zoning district.

Resolutions:

Resolution 2013-19 - authorized Staff to apply for funding from the U.S. 17-92 Community Redevelopment Agency for redevelopment projects.

Resolution 2013-21 - authorized additional parcels to be included in the Tusawilla Lighting and Beautification Assessment Area (maintenance only) and submission of the assessment rolls relating to Oak Forest Wall and Beautification District and the Tusawilla Lighting and Beatification Assessment Area Phases I and II.

Resolution 2013-22 - established the Tusawilla Phase III Special Assessment Area for the repair and maintenance of the Tusawilla Units 12/12A Wall.

Resolution 2013-27 - Authorized an agreement with Alternative Wall Systems for repair and reconstruction of the Tusawilla Units 12/12A entrance walls.

Contracts/Agreements:

- The City Commission authorized the execution of an agreement between the City of Winter Springs and ILPA Distribution Concessions, regarding the operation of the two concession stands in Central Winds Park.
- The City Commission authorized an agreement between the City of Winter Springs and the Oviedo-Winter Springs Chamber of Commerce for the 6th Annual Winter Springs Festival of the Arts.
- The City Commission authorized an agreement with Eastwood Tuff Turf of Central Florida, Inc., for State Road 434 Landscape Maintenance.
- The City Commission authorized a two year contract for audit services with the firm of McDermitt Davis & Company, LLC.
- The City Commission authorized the renewal of the annual School Resource Officer agreement with City of Winter Springs and the Seminole County School Board.
- The City Commission authorized an amendment to the Contract with Ashbritt Environmental for a 1 year extension to perform storm debris removal services.
- The City Commission authorized the Final Engineering Plans and Aesthetic Review for Seven Oaks, which lays the groundwork for the development of 138 single-family homes and 2.09 acres of future commercial property fronting Shepard Road.
- The City Commission approved an agreement with Greener Grounds, LLC., for City facilities landscape maintenance.

Of Special Interest:

- The Mayor and City Commission extended the current temporary on-street parking moratorium for an additional six months to permit the Police Department to continue to evaluate the situation.
- The Mayor and City Commission recognized and presented “Character Counts” awards to campers in the Camp Sunshine Summer Camp program for outstanding character traits.



Beginning on January 1, 2014, we will only accept plans using the specified electronic formats.

TIP OF THE MONTH

Halloween Safety

“Un-haunting” Your House and Neighborhood



- Welcome trick-or-treaters at home by turning on your exterior lights.
- Remove objects from your yard that may present a hazard to visitors.
- Ask your Neighborhood Watch or citizens group to patrol the community.
- Drive slowly all evening—you never know what may suddenly cross your path.
- Report any suspicious or criminal activity to the police department.

Eating the Treats

- Kids need to know that they should not eat their treats until they get home.
- Check all treats at home in a well-lighted place.
- Only eat unopened candies and other treats that are in original wrappers. Don't forget to inspect fruit and homemade goodies for anything suspicious.

Preparing Ghosts and Goblins for Their Tricks and Treats

- Make sure older kids go out with friends. Younger children should be accompanied by an adult. If you live in a rural area, offer all kids a ride in the car.
- Set a time limit for children to trick-or-treat. Together, map out a safe route so you know where they'll be. Remind them not to take short-cuts through backyards, alleys, or playing fields.
- Remind kids not to enter a strange house or car.
- Try to get kids to trick-or-treat while it is still light out. If it is dark, make sure a couple of people are carrying flashlights that work.

Make Safe Costumes


- Check that costumes are flame-retardant so the little ones aren't in danger near candle-lit jack-o-lanterns and other fire hazards.
- Keep costumes short to prevent trips, falls, and other bumps in the night.
- Encourage kids to wear comfortable shoes.
- Try make-up instead of a mask. Masks can be hot and uncomfortable and, more importantly, they can obstruct a child's vision— a dangerous thing when kids are crossing streets and going up and down steps.
- Make sure kids wear light colors or put reflective tape on their costumes.



City of Winter Springs Construction Project Update October 2013

Project: SR 434 and Tuskawilla Road Intersection Improvements

Description: This project includes safety and operational improvements to the SR 434 and Tuskawilla Road intersection. The project will also enhance the Market Square portion of the Winter Springs Town Center.

Funding Source: This project is federally funded through a Local Agency Program Agreement with FDOT.

Status: The design is scheduled to be completed in late 2013 and is being performed by AECOM. The project is not funded for construction.

Project: Edgemon/Lombardy Ditch Piping

Description: This project consists of the piping and filling of the ditch between South Devon Avenue and South Fairfax Avenue just North of Lombardy Road, as well as the ditch between South Edgemon Avenue and South Flamingo Avenue just South of Burgos Road. This project will improve the drainage of the ditches and the surrounding areas and reduce long-term maintenance costs.

Funding Source: Stormwater Utility Fund

Status: The design was completed by CDM and construction is scheduled for 2014.

Project: Moss Road Improvements

Description: The Moss Road Improvements Project includes resurfacing Moss Road North of SR 434, as well as drainage and landscaping improvements. This project will improve North Moss Road to have a similar look and feel as South Moss Road, with a landscaped median near SR 434.

Funding Source: One-Cent Sales Tax

Status: Design is scheduled for late 2013 and construction is scheduled for 2014.

Project: Winding Hollow Deceleration Lane

Description: The Winding Hollow Deceleration Lane Project will provide a right turn deceleration lane on eastbound SR 434 into the Winding Hollow subdivision.

Funding Source: This project is federally funded through a Local Agency Program Agreement with FDOT.

Status: The design is scheduled to be completed in late 2013 and is being performed by Pegasus Engineering. Construction is scheduled for 2014.

Project: Offices at Winding Hollow – Builder: Strasberg Construction & Development. The Professional Office complex will consist of six (6) single-story buildings having a total of 19,230 square feet of professional office space on 2.9 acres of property located on the west side of Winding Hollow Boulevard just south of State Road 434. The project is now underway and scheduled to be completed by 2014.

City of Winter Springs Construction Project Update

October 2013

Project: Jesup's Landing – Builder: Mattamy Homes. A place where casual living is perfectly defined and families will find everything they need to enjoy life at home and in the community. The project features 171 townhomes in 30 building units, located on the south side of Orange Ave, behind the Winter Springs High School. Construction is still ongoing.

Project: Jesup's Reserve – Builder: DR Horton. Luxury Southern Style multi-level new townhomes with unique touches throughout, located across from the Town Center on State Road 434. Nearing completion; the final buildings are under construction.

Project: Magnolia Park – The construction of the Magnolia Park Amphitheater is on hold until the City receives a warranty deed from the State conveying approximately 0.44 acres of adjacent trail right of way to the City. This adjacent trail right of way is needed because the amphitheater building encroaches into the States' trail right of way. This encroachment will allow maximum utilization of this facility given the constraints of the site. Additional updates will be made available as information is forthcoming.

Project: Seven Oaks Subdivision – Builder: Meritage Homes. The City is waiting for submittal of the final plans on a newly proposed Seven Oaks Subdivision, located on the south side of Shepard Road, north of Florida Avenue, east of Boat Lake, near the City's boundary with State Road 17-92.

Project: Southern Oaks Subdivision - The 50-acre development, the Southern Oaks subdivision, will have around 95 houses near the Oviedo-Winter Springs line along State Road 434 across from the Black Hammock preserve. Approximately 4 1/2- acre parcel will be used for a retention pond. The developer will only be able to use the 4 1/2 acres as green space, not for building. Project still under development.

Project: Race Trac Gas and Convenience Center – Staff is working with the Race Trac Company to redevelop the abandoned Hess Gas station site located at the intersection of SR 419 and U.S. Highway 17-92. The project will involve the annexation of three additional parcels of land south of the existing site. Construction to begin soon.

Project: Grandville at Town Center – Developer: LeCesse Development Corp. A 4 story 160 unit Apartment Home Complex, reflective of the historic downtown layout of the Town Center, to be located adjacent to the City Hall just off State Road 434. Project still under development.

Project: Greens at Tuskawilla – Builder: TGD Orlando, LLC. Sophisticated, spacious townhomes nestled along the Fairway at Tuskawilla Golf Course. Construction is still ongoing.

Project: Hayes Road Plaza – New Contractor is Harbco. Project to be developed as a convenience store plaza. Site work is ongoing.

Project: Artesian Park - Artesian Park is a 7.87 acre, 106 town house units, a plaza with a clubhouse and pool development site. Located within the Winter Springs Town Center with planned 800,000 sf retail, 600,000 sf office & 700 hotel rooms. Within walking distance of the Town Center. Project still under development.

City of Winter Springs Construction Project Update

October 2013

Project: Cross Seminole Trail – The Cross Seminole Trail has a missing link from Layer elementary to the west end of Old Sanford / Oviedo Road. In order for the State to convey the adjacent trail right of way to the City, the City is offering an equivalent area of unimproved right of way near Old Sanford / Oviedo Road. This unimproved right of way will be used as a portion of the property needed to complete the Cross Seminole Trail missing link. Additional property along SR 419 and Layer Elementary is being donated by Bart Phillips to complete this section of the trail corridor. Mr. Phillips is also receiving a small piece of right of way from the State that will no longer be needed once this alignment is finalized. This approval allows for a land swap to be completed with the State to allow for the construction of the Magnolia Park Amphitheater. Staff requested the trail width be increased from 12' to 14' to be consistent with the rest of the trail in the City. The construction of the Magnolia Park Amphitheater is on hold until the City receives a warranty deed from the State conveying to the City approximately 0.44 acres of adjacent trail right of way to the City. This adjacent trail right of way is needed because the amphitheater building encroaches into the State's trail right of way. This encroachment will allow maximum utilization of this facility given the constraints of the site. Additional updates will be made available as information is forthcoming.

Project: Amberly Subdivision – Builder: KB Home. Beautifully appointed one and two story single family homes conveniently located near the Oviedo Mall, just off Red Bug Lake Road near SR-417. Construction still ongoing.

DUKE ENERGY RELIABILITY IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY



Residents have been inquiring about noticeable increases in momentary power outages (a few seconds) as well as longer power outages this summer. We have been working with representatives from Duke Energy, who are aware that you have experienced an unusually high number of outages in recent months. Some of the issues have been due to the severe storms in your area, as well as trees and other vegetation falling on power lines. However, Duke Energy has also identified various reliability improvement projects throughout the area. The following is an update regarding those projects:

- Storm hardening work in the Fox Glen area began in June and should be completed by mid-December, weather permitting. This project involves the installation of new underground cable, the installation of a new switchgear and the removal overhead lines. This project will reduce overhead line exposure and improve reliability in the area.
- Underground cable replacement work in the Seneca Blvd. area was completed last week. A new switchgear and new underground cable was installed and energize. Duke Energy is currently removing the deenergized overhead cable. Similar to the Fox Glen area, this project will reduce the overhead line exposure and improve reliability in the area.
- Duke Energy engineers recently identified a 3,000 foot section of overhead line along State Road 434 that will be replaced. This extensive project is currently in the design phase. Construction will begin as soon as the appropriate state permits are obtained. This overhead cable project will take two-three months to complete once construction begins. We will have further updates regarding the timing of this project in the coming weeks.


