

During the month of September 2015, the following Ordinance, Resolutions, Contracts, and Agreements, were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

Ordinance:

- The City Commission adopted Ordinance 2015-19, which proposes to amend Chapter 20, Zoning, of the Code of Ordinances to establish a limited administrative waiver procedure for approving deviations from the City Code.

Resolutions:

- The City Commission adopted Resolution 2015-20, which established the Final Operating Millage Rate and the Final Voted Debt Service Millage Rate for Fiscal Year 2016 for the City of Winter Springs.
- The City Commission adopted Resolution 2015-21, establishing the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2016. (cont'd)
- The City Commission adopted Resolution 2015-25, which authorized the acquisition of surplus lands from the Florida Department of Transportation in the vicinity of State Road 434 and Gardena Avenue.


Contracts/Agreements

- The City Commission authorized the acceptance of a \$500.00 grant from the Property and Evidence Association of Florida.
- The City Commission approved authorization to enter into an agreement with MCG Services LLC for construction of concrete sidewalk and curb replacement at various locations.
- The City Commission approved an agreement between the City of Winter Springs and Brian Susa, BBS Concessions, LLC, regarding concession operations at Central Winds Park.
- The City Commission approved an Easement Encroachment Agreement for Lot 138 in the Seven Oaks Subdivision.
- The City Commission validated the staff's recommendation finding the Dunkin Donuts sitework to be built in substantial accordance with the final engineering plans, subject to satisfactory completion of the remaining open punchlist items.
- The City Commission approved the renewal and payment of the annual Cisco Smartnet Maintenance Agreement through Veytec, Inc.
- The City Commission approved renewal of a contract with The Lake Doctors, Inc. for one year for aquatic weed control and maintenance services of City-maintained lakes, ponds, and other stormwater facilities.
- The City Commission authorized Starmer Design Group to perform cost reduction redesign work for the Magnolia Park Amphitheater Project.

In order to avoid a three week gap between recycling services to residents serviced on Fridays, recycling service will be provided on Saturday, January 2nd, 2016 for those customers whose recycling is normally picked up on Friday. The rest of the holiday schedule is as follows;

Time Change= \$\$ Savings

Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 1st. When turning your clocks back one hour, don't forget to adjust the clock on your irrigation timer. More importantly, don't forget to adjust your watering days from two days per week to one day per week. Standard Time incorporates late fall and winter; a time when grass and landscape plants are dormant. The plants are not growing as rapidly as they do during the spring and summer, and therefore require less water. Adjusting your irrigation to account for seasonal change and your lawn's water requirements is a great way to conserve water and save money.

If you are unsure how to adjust your irrigation timer or would like to ensure you are applying the correct amount of water to sustain your lawn through the winter, please contact the City to schedule a free irrigation audit. We will help you adjust your timer and can measure the amount of water your irrigation system is applying to ensure your lawn is receiving enough water to keep it healthy during the winter months. Daylight saving time begins the second Sunday in March and ends the first Sunday in November. Watering restrictions apply to all potable, well, and surface water sources.
Reclaimed water may be used two days per week year round.

17th Annual Shop with a Cop

Each year in December the Winter Springs Police Department takes needy children shopping for the holidays. This is the 17th year for the Winter Springs “Shop with a Cop” program. The children arrive at the Police Department early Saturday morning and get partnered up with a Winter Springs Police officer. The children then head over to Señor Tequila’s to start the day with pancakes, eggs and Santa Claus. Then a lights-and-sirens-blaring caravan brings the children to Wal-Mart for a \$150 shopping spree. The caravan then heads to the Civic Center, where the children and their helpers wrap their gifts. The Police Report:

Holiday Safety!



Thanksgiving is quickly approaching. If you're going to deep fry that bird, here are some things to remember:

1. Hot oil may splash or spill during the cooking. Contact between hot oil and skin could result in serious injury.
2. A hot oil spill can happen with fryers designed for outdoor use using a stand. The fryer could tip over or collapse causing the hot oil to spill. Newer countertop units using a solid base appear to reduce this risk. NFPA does not believe the risks of either type of turkey fryer to be acceptable because of the large amount of hot oil involved and the speed and severity of burns.
3. In deep frying, oil is heated to temperatures of 350° Fahrenheit or more. Cooking oil is combustible. If it is heated above its cooking temperature, its vapors can ignite.
4. Propane-fired turkey fryers must be used outdoors. They are very popular for Thanksgiving. Many parts of the country may have rain or snow at this time of year. If rain or snow hits the hot cooking oil, the oil may splatter or turn to steam, leading to burns.
5. The Turkeys must be completely thawed before placing in the fryer because a partially thawed turkey can cause the hot oil to splatter and cause serious burns.
6. The fryers use a lot of oil, about five gallons. Considering the size and weight of the turkey, extreme caution must be taken when placing and removing the turkey from the fryer to be sure

it is not dropped back into the fryer, splattering the oil on the chef.
7. NFPA urges those who prefer fried turkey to look for grocery stores, specialty food retailers, and restaurants that sell deep fried turkeys, or consider a new type of “oil-less” turkey fryer.”

Active Projects




Cross Seminole Trail:

- The Cross Seminole Trail has a missing link from Layer Elementary to the west end of Old Sanford/Oviedo Road. The planned connection will continue from the current terminus at Layer and run northerly adjacent to SR 419. The City is working with the County and the State to facilitate the construction of this section of the trail.

Magnolia Park Amphitheater:

- The Magnolia Park Amphitheater is proposed to be constructed at the eastern end of Blumberg Blvd. Construction is anticipated to begin in early 2016 with completion in the fall of 2016.



Assisted Living Facility:

- The City is working with the Hawthorne Group for a proposed assisted living facility. The facility will consist of 144 units with congregate dining, and entertainment options. Engineered plans are scheduled to be submitted in early December.





CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



Dunkin' Donuts:

• The multi-unit project is located at the S.E. corner of SR 434 and Stone Gable Circle. The facility opened Friday, September 25, 2015. Marketing is underway for the three additional retail spaces.



The Greens at Tusawilla:

• The 60 unit townhome project is located on Winter Springs Blvd. adjacent to the Tusawilla Country Club. The project is approximately 93% complete.



Jesup's Landing:

• The project consist of 171 townhomes in 30 building units on 17 acres of land located on the south side of Orange Ave., behind Winter Springs High School. Construction is ongoing and the project is approximately 90% complete.





CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



Offices at Winding Hollow (West side):

- The Office complex has 4 of the 6 proposed buildings complete. The project is on hold while financial issues are resolved.



Opportunity Sites:

- Winter Springs offers excellent opportunities for the development of high technology industries. Situated on the eastern edge of the City, Seminole Way is a strategic economic development initiative focused on attracting high value jobs and businesses to Seminole County. The State Road 417 (Central Florida

Greenway) corridor defines the boundaries of the Seminole Way district, spanning the length of Seminole County and connecting to both Orange County's "Innovation Way" and the "Medical City" located at Lake Nona. The City has targeted this Greenway Interchange District (GID) for technology industry development complemented by commercial and retail establishments. It is expected to become a premier employment center with professional and high tech office buildings, conference facilities, and hotel rooms.



The GID opportunity site is comprised of 26 potential sites with over 378 acres. One of the key features of this opportunity site is the ease of assemblage: it offers the largest consolidation of vacant developable land within the City under the ownership of only 3 land owners.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



Plante Property (Tuskawilla Crossing):

- The proposed project will include approximately 373 residential units comprised of traditional single family detached homes and detached bungalow units on lots ranging from 34ft. to 70ft. in width. In addition, the project will include a commercial component. Staff is working with the applicant on final modifications to the site design. At the 10/26/15 meeting, the City Commission approved a Special Exception for 16 single family units in the T5 (Town Center Zone) of the Town Center. In addition, the first reading of the Future Land Use Amendment for the the church property at 395 Tuskawilla Road was approved and changed from Public/Semi-Public to Low Density residential. Zoning remains PUD for the property.

Pollack Shores Apartments:

- The project is approximately 300 units in the Winter Springs Town Center, located east of Tuskawilla Road. Staff is working with the developer's Engineer and Architect to finalize the project details. The engineering plans are currently being reviewed by staff. The review should be completed by late November, 2015.



The Professional Offices (East side):

- The Professional Offices will be located on the east side of Winding Hollow Boulevard and are proposed to be more upscale than the west side offices. The project is on hold while financial issues are resolved.





CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



The RiZE at Winter Springs:

- This project is located east of City Hall in the Winter Springs Town Center. Construction on the residential units is underway. Occupancy of the first units is scheduled for January 2016.

Seven Oaks Subdivision:

- The project consist of 138 single-family units located on the south side of Shepard Road, north of Florida Avenue, east of Boat Lake, near the City's boundary on U.S. HWY 17-92. Construction of the residential units continues. Approxiamately 91% of the 138 units have been constructed or permitted.



Southern Oaks Subdivision:

- The Southern Oaks subdivision, consist of a 50-acre development, with approximately 92 houses near the Oviedo and Winter Springs boundary along SR 434. Site work on the Winter Springs portion of the project is expected to commence in late 2015.

The City is now accepting Building Plans electronically. Paper Building Plans are no longer accepted. All Building Plans must be submitted with a computer online through the ePlans ProjectDox Plan Review System.
